
ome Republicans are concerned over the way Donald Trump "mean-talks." They think he should be cleaning up his act after his near-death experience.

Vote Early!

We recommend that you vote as soon as you receive your ballot in your mail. Take it to the post office or walk it into the County Registrar's office. Only ask for a new ballot if you make a mistake on your original. Any wayward mark on a ballot will make it unreadable to the vote-counting machine. You want to avoid using a pink Provisional ballot.

If you choose to vote in person, you need NOT surrender your mailed ballot. In fact, it's best if you haven't even opened the envelope. If the poll worker claims that

you've already voted, that unopened ballot is your proof that it was not YOU.




Ballot harvesting is now law, due to the liberal hold on California. It is legal, and we need to use it. If we do not use ballot collection, it will only advantage the Left. Helping other Republicans vote — the right way — is imperative. Lists of local candidates and propositions should be at hand. (See pages 8 & 9).

When someone says "How should I vote?" take the time to tell them. Offer to help fill out and deliver ballots of anyone wishing this support.

Winning the Battle

Do not allow the talking heads and negative news media get to you. Despite what you may think or hear, this election is not an easy win. With the recent success of the Trump Trains, rallies, and the massive crowds behind our candidate, we know we have the winner. Here's an easy telephone SCRIPT:

My name is ______. I'm a constituent. I'm calling to ask (name of elected official) to vote **NO** (or **YES**, depending on the legislation) on *(Bill number)*

You may BRIEFLY state your reasons – no more than a sentence or two — but it isn't really necessary. Call every day. Thank the staff member for taking your call.

Confused by the 2024 Ballot Propositions? Here's guidance from the GSRW Legislative Analyst

Proposition 2

Authorizes Bonds for Public School and Community College Facilities.

A YES vote means: The state could issue (borrow) \$10 billion in bonds to build new or renovate existing public school and community college facilities. A NO vote means: The state could not issue (borrow) the above-mentioned \$10 billion in bonds.

SUPPORT:

California Federation of Teachers Los Angeles Unified School District

OPPOSE:

Voters who do not want higher taxes

Proposition 3

Constitutional Right to Marry and Repeal Proposition 8 Amendment.

A YES vote means: Repealing Proposition 8 (2008), which defined marriage as a union between one man and one woman and declare that a "right to marry is a fundamental right" in the California Constitution.

A NO vote means: Keep Proposition 8 in effect — no Constitutional change.

SUPPORT:

Governor Gavin Newsom California Democratic Party

OPPOSE:

California Family Council Concerned Women for America Legislative Action Committee

Proposition 4

Authorizes Bonds for Parks, Environment, Energy, and Water.

A YES vote means: The state could issue (borrow) \$10 billion in bonds to fund state and local parks, environmental protection projects, energy projects, etc. A NO vote means: The state could not borrow \$10 billion to fund these projects.

SUPPORT:

California Labor Federation Environmental Defense Fund

OPPOSE:

Howard Jarvis Taxpayers Assn. California Republican Party

Proposition 5

Lower the Supermajority Requirement to 55% for Local Bond Measures to Fund Housing and Public Infrastructure Amendment.

A <u>YES</u> vote means: Local bonds and related property taxes could be approved with a 55 percent vote of the local electorate, rather than the current two-thirds approval requirement. Affected bonds would have to be used to fund affordable housing, supportive housing, or public infrastructure.

A <u>NO</u> vote means: Bonds and related property taxes would continue to require approval by two-thirds vote of the local electorate.

California Republican Party Howard Jarvis Taxpayers Assn.

Proposition 6

Remove Involuntary Servitude as Punishment for Crime Amendment

(NOTE: The California Constitution prohibits slavery and involuntary servitude, except as punishment to a crime.)

A <u>YES</u> vote means: Amending the state Constitution to prohibit involuntary servitude as punishment for crime.
A <u>NO</u> vote means: Opposing amending the state Constitution in this regard.

SUPPORT:

California Labor Federation ACLU of California

OPPOSE:

Howard Jarvis Taxpayers Assn.

Note: Some lawmakers have voiced concerns over the billions of dollars it would cost the state yearly should a minimum wage mandate ever be issued on behalf of incarcerated people.

Proposition 32

Raises Minimum Wage to \$18 Initiative

A <u>YES</u> vote means: The state minimum wage would increase to \$18 per hour by 2026 with future adjustments annually for cost-of-living increases.

A <u>NO</u> vote means: Maintaining the existing law which was designed to increase the minimum wage to \$15 per hour

for all employers by January

Propositions, continued

2023 with future annual increases for inflation.

OPPOSE:

John Kabateck, State Director of the National Federation of Independent Business: "Market, not politicians and bureaucrats, ought to be dictating the financial growth and success of working men and women in California. Let the market dictate this and let's stop sending the message that mediocrity is a pathway to professional success."

Proposition 33

Prohibit State Limitations on Local Rent Control Initiative

A <u>YES</u> vote means: Repeal the Costa-Hawkins Rental Housing Act (for the past 30 years, it has prohibited local rent control ordinances on single-family homes). A Yes vote would mean cities and counties could <u>limit rent</u> on any type of housing, further enabling residential rent control.

A <u>NO</u> vote means: Keeping the Costa-Hawkins Rental Housing Act in effect.

OPPOSE:

Republican Party of California California Small Business Assn. California Apartment Assn. Howard Jarvis Taxpayers Assn.

Proposition 34

Require Certain Participants in Medi-Cal RX Program to Spend 98% of Revenues on Patient Care Initiative

A <u>YES</u> vote means: Certain health care entities would have to follow new rules about how they spend revenue they earn from a federal drug discount program. Breaking these rules would result in loss of taxexempt status and licenses to operate health insurance plans, pharmacies and clinics.

A <u>NO</u> vote means: No change

A <u>NO</u> vote means: No change to the current spending practices of health care providers.

Proposition 35

Managed Care Organization Tax Authorization Initiative (Creation of New Healthcare Fund)

A <u>YES</u> vote means: An existing state tax on health plans that provides funding for certain health programs would become permanent and require revenues be used for increased Medi-Cal programs.

A <u>NO</u> vote means: An existing state tax on health plans would end in 2026.

SUPPORT:

California Democratic Party Republican Party of California California Medical Assn.

OPPOSE:

League of Women Voters of California

Proposition 36

Drug and Theft Crime Penalties and Treatment-Mandated Felonies Initiative

A YES vote means: Making changes to Proposition 47, which was approved in 2014. People convicted of certain drug or theft crimes could receive increased punishment, such as longer prison sentences. In certain cases, people who possess illegal drugs would be required to complete treatment. Also requires increased sentences for theft based on the value of the property stolen. A **NO** vote means: Proposition 47 would not change — certain drug and theft crimes would continue to be classified as misdemeanors.


Stop shenanigans in the classroom!

Here's What a Weekend of Campaigning Looks Like

hico Evening Republican Women (CERW) went out of their way this summer to help the Donald Trump campaign. They held a birthday party for him on June 14, organized their first Trump Caravan on June 15 and a second on July 20 — with dozens of vehicles.

'Trump Train' Weekend

To recognize President Trump for the Statewide California Trump Train the weekend of August 16, 17 and 18, CERW held a Trump Caravan on Friday, Aug 16 for the Butte County Republican Party, who had become exhausted from other projects and were ready to cancel the caravan.

CERW stepped up and organized the Trump Train for the 16th. It was attended by more than two dozen vehicles. and the group completed the evening at the local Republican watering and dining hole, The Tackle Box in Chico.
